

Follow signs for the Arboretum. As you exit onto the ramp, continue driving straight onto Montauk Highway (Rt27A) and go past the light. Entrance to the Arboretum will be on your right.

From the East:

Sunrise Hwy west to Connetquot Ave South.

When you reach Montauk Hwy make a left and travel 1/4 mile. Entrance to the Arboretum will be on your right.

Volunteer Staff and Show Flower Entrants:

If you plan to arrive early to display flowers or are volunteering at the show, please use service entrance, which is 50 feet east of main entrance. Go to the right and follow signs to the Carriage House.

The Long Island Dahlia Society



The Long Island Dahlia Society (LIDS) was formed in the spring of 1944 by a group of air raid wardens and dahlia fanciers led by Otto Aumuller. Early meetings took place around a pot-bellied stove at Munz's Nursery in Jamaica, New York and were often held in the fertilizer shed.

Mr. Aumuller brought together the first show to the public where hundreds of milk bottles were collected and gilded so that all the blooms were resplendent in golden containers. Eventually the meetings moved to Jamaica Hall, and in the years since then, LIDS has exhibited throughout much of Long Island.

LIDS is dedicated to the cultivation and propagation of the dahlia. LIDS volunteers plant and maintain a garden of 1000+ dahlias at Bayard Cutting Arboretum in Great River, NY. LIDS hosts a dahlia show each season at the Bayard Cutting Arboretum, on Labor Day Weekend.

LIDS holds meetings on the third Thursday of the month, either at the East Islip Public Library or at the Arboretum. Check the LIDS website (www.longIslanddahlia.org) for meeting specifics. Meetings are free and the public is welcome.

Membership is \$20.00 per family per year, new members receive three free tubers (selection as available) during the spring. By becoming a member, you can learn about the culture of dahlias at our monthly meetings and the methods used by our own experienced growers. We invite you to participate in our shows, displaying dahlias or just visiting and enjoying the beauty of the flowers.

Visit the Wolkoff Dahlia Garden

Follow the signs from the Carriage House and visit the Wolkoff Garden. You will find one of the largest public display gardens in the Northeast. There are over 1,000 dahlias, from the tiny to the dinner plate size, and during the show times, the blooms are at their peak.

Rules for Dahlia Show Entries

- The latest classification list of the American Dahlia Society is to be used, with exhibits entered accordingly, non-classified entries to be entered as they appear.
- Show is open to all exhibitors. No entry fee to be charged, Exhibitors must sign the register book. All entries must be in place by 11:00AM.
- Suitable containers will be supplied for all classes, with the exception of baskets.
- There will be no restrictions as to the number of blooms entered from one garden in any class, except for the Show Flower.
- 5. In 2025 the Challenge Flower is "Spartacus". There is a limit of one (1) entry per person.
- 6. Entries must be correctly labeled with cultivar name.
- 7. The Exhibitor's name must be concealed. All entries will remain sealed until Tricolor and further awards are chosen. Failure to observe this rule will disqualify the entry.
- 8. All entries must be grown by the exhibitor.
- Flowers other than dahlias are not permitted. All materials used to support stems must be removed before judging, or the entry will be disqualified. One set of leaves are required on all entries.
- All judges and clerks will be called in at 10:45AM to set up judging teams. Judging will begin promptly at 11:00AM.
- 11. Only judges, clerks, and committee people are permitted on the floor during judging.

No exhibit shall be removed from the hall without the Show Committee's consent.

Rules for Dahlia Show Entries

- 12. First, second and third awards will be made in each class (except seedlings). No award will be made in any class if the entry is unworthy. Tricolors are awarded as noted in the schedule.
- 13. The decision of the judges will be final. No appeals will be considered except in cases where the entry is in the wrong class. In this case the show committee may consider the appeal and act as they see fit.
- 14. LIDS shall not be held responsible for loss or damage to exhibits or personal property but will exercise the utmost care to protect exhibits. Baskets should be labeled with the Exhibitor's name and address for proper return.
- 15. The show committee reserves the right to make additional rules, classes or to change the schedule as it becomes necessary, or to remove from the tables before or after judging any exhibit considered in poor condition.
- 16. All entries except Exhibitor's baskets become the property of the Show Committee to be disposed of at their own discretion at the close of the show.
- 17. Dahlia foliage is preferred in baskets. Other foliage is permitted in baskets but should not overpower the dahlias.
- 18. All baskets must have the same color and form except the multibloom basket. All baskets must have handles and be no more than 24" overall.

Judges may not participate in decisions involving their own interests or entries. In the event a substitute judge is required, that judge must sign the appropriate clerk sheet.


